It has been set up for NGOs from across the world to mount exhibitions that showcase their work in a creative and positive way and aims to provide a refreshing counter-balance to the mainstream.

Over 44 organisations are represented in **The Thirst World**. They will provide you with a wealth of information on water issues of public concern from different continents and cultures. They will discuss with you their campaigns and research on issues such as the privatisation of water utilities, industrial pollution of rivers and lakes, problems of large dams, poor sanitation, depletion of aquifers and more. They will also be presenting innovative solutions proven to work at a local level and drawn directly from their experience.

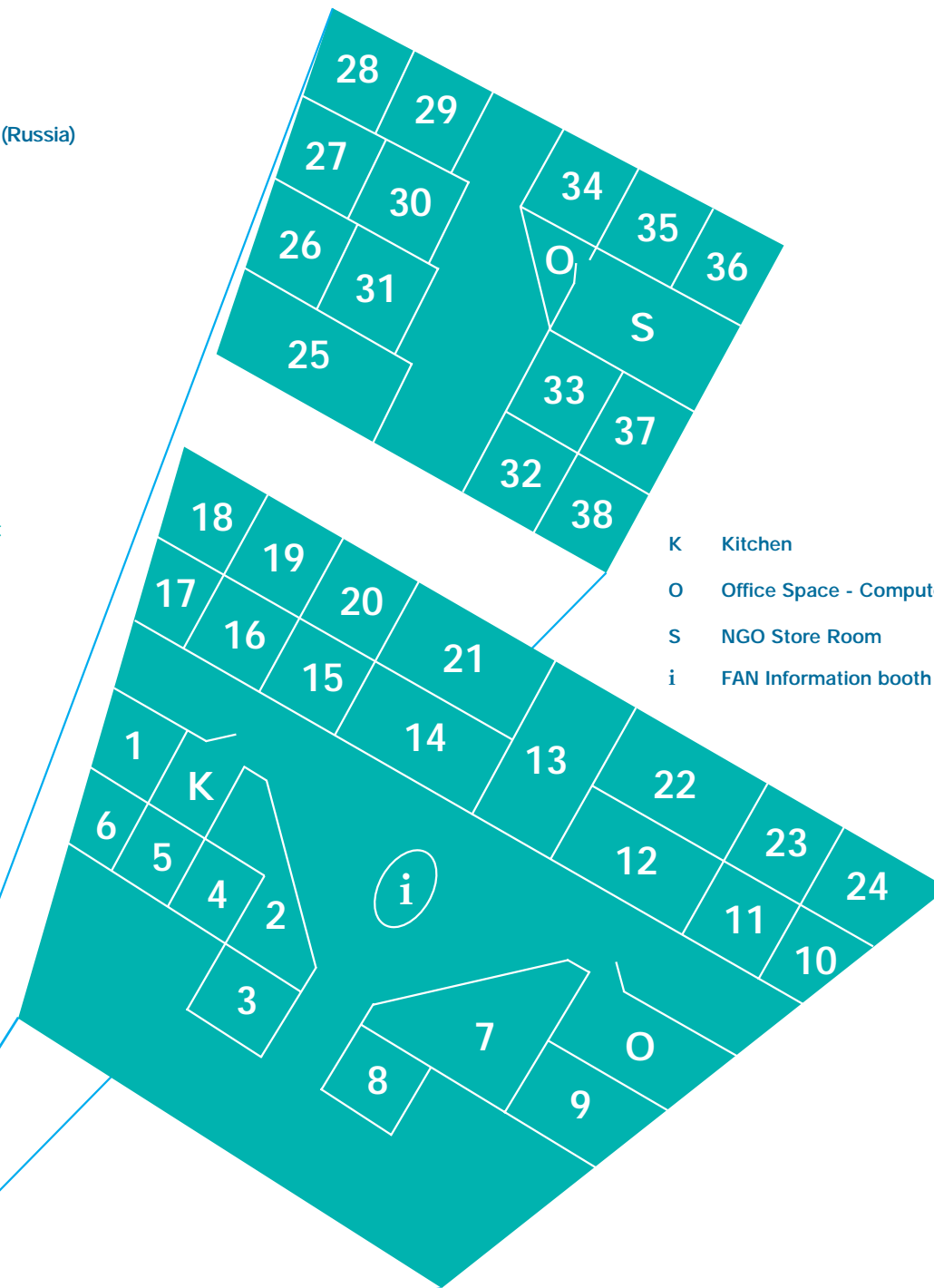

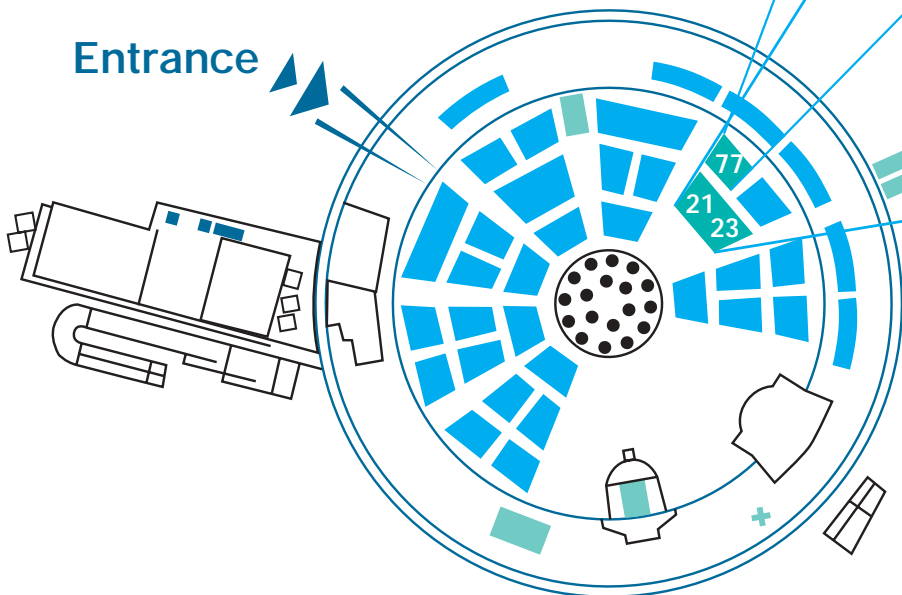
